Sheyna Strommen will share the story of her son Clint, who was diagnosed with LAMA2-related congenital muscular dystrophy. Through hospital stays, uncertainty, and unexpected challenges, their family has leaned on scripture, prayer and the support of their community. With honesty, humor and hope, Sheyna will reflect on what Clint has taught them about faith in difficult seasons and how God’s work can be revealed through the people who walk alongside us.

Sheyna and Aaron Strommen, along with their children Cassidy, Cooper, and Clint, own and operate the Strommen Ranch in Solen, North Dakota. When Sheyna isn’t busy on the ranch or taking care of Clint she enjoys helping Clint show his 4-H sheep and designing sales catalogs for area ranchers.
